

Ein Weinberg der Völker –

A Vineyard of the Nations



Most people associate Munich with the tradition of beer brewing and consumption. Did you ever wonder why grapes are considered a somewhat exotic plant here, and why vine has to be imported from far-more northern or eastern countries, like from Franconia or Austria? In fact, it was Munich's flat topography, rather than the climate itself that made the city and the surrounding upper Bavaria a less suitable area for grape cultivation.

But as you can see on the picture above (taken yesterday in our garden in Munich Bogenhausen), grapes grow quite well in Munich.

We want to found a „Vineyard of the Nations“ on one of the southward-facing wasteland hills here in Munich (Olympia-Berg, Riemer Berg or Fröttmanning Landfill). We hope to attract for this plan native Munich folks but also people who arrived here as refugees from countries inflicted by civil wars and terror.

We therefore will found the registered society „**Weinberg der Völker e.V.**“ with friends from Afghanistan, Israel, Russland, Iran, USA and Germany. We'd like to invite you to join us as a founding member at the 1st assembly of this society.
